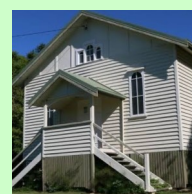

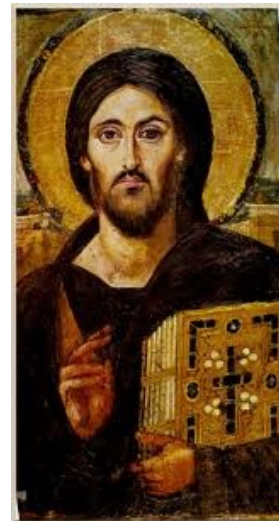

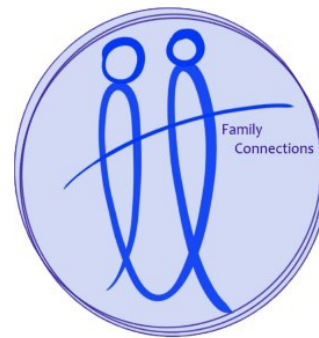

CHANGES IN 2021—On March 20 last year, The Catholic Leader made a digital newspaper available for free while the print edition was put on hold due to COVID-19 restrictions. We are happy to advise that The Catholic Leader will return as a print newspaper on the **first Sunday of February**.

To coincide with the revival of The Catholic Leader print newspaper, they will be making several changes to the publication. In 2021, The Catholic Leader newspaper will be a **monthly** publication. This change will allow their journalists more time to craft news stories that are better researched, more representative of all sides of an issue, and most importantly, strive for objectivity. As with their previous print editions, The Catholic Leader will be a paid publication with an increased cover price of \$4 to cover all associated expenses.

Initially, the papers will be made available in Brisbane archdiocesan parishes, but we are asking all readers to consider taking up a **subscription**. Subscriptions will start from \$50/year for paper delivery, and until June 27, you will get complimentary access to the monthly digital replica newspaper, and unlimited digital access to catholicleader.com.au. Your newspaper will be delivered to your nominated postal address by the first Sunday of every month.

You can take up a new print subscription by visiting catholicleader.com.au/subscribe, email editor@catholicleader.com.au or call our friendly team on (07) 3324 3555. The final free digital newspaper will be the January 31 edition. The Catholic Leader will continue to publish regular, free news on their website, and hope to develop Member-only extras such as columns, videos, and insights. We thank all our parishioners for your support and patience during this pandemic, and for your continued support of the Catholic Leader in the future.
