This weeks Readings:

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Gen 22:1-2, 9-13, 15-18; Rom 8:31-34; Mk 9:2-10

Some time ago I was researching the permanent diaconate ministry for a journal article and I also accessed my formation study notes, and there it was: "**Ministry is a privilege, not a right!**" I never forget that in the exercise of my own ministry, but it stood out to me as a stark reminder.

I remember that during our formation as permanent deacons we had a session with the late Fr John Reilly SJ, who told us: "Don't get lost in a role or title. Don't lose sight of the faith community. It's about relationships (communication); serving the faith community".

It is a privilege for me as a deacon to connect with people in all their diversity, both within the Church and beyond. It is a privilege to be invited into the lives of people who need help or support or encouragement – not just in matters of faith, but in other ways as well. In these troubled times, people need ministers who can be trusted; who are not self-serving; who have not gotten lost in a role or title.

Fr O'Reilly was right when he spoke about the value of relationships in ministry. We deal with flesh-and-blood people in all their diversity, with all of their emotions and feelings. We need to be open to all people, accepting of where they are in their lives, and to be sensitive to what they are experiencing. Doing this promotes the building of trustworthy relationships.

For example, I value the special connection I make with families in helping them to plan funerals of their departed loved ones. But it is more than planning the funeral itself. I am conscious that many of these people, like many who come for baptisms, have little connection with the Church, and so I endeavor to ensure that their experience of "Church" is positive and meaningful for them as much as possible, particularly as a Church minister.

Irrespective of ordained ministry, we are all called to live our lives in loving service of God and each other. There will be times when it is difficult to do so. But Jesus teaches his disciples that, though abilities and talents will surely differ from one person to another, what one does with what one is given is the important thing. No-one is expected to do more than is humanly possible; however, we are all expected to make some positive difference with the abilities and talents given to us.

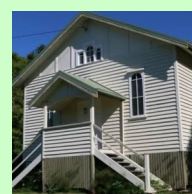
To love one another is to see the face of God.

Margret, 39, is a teacher at a vocational school for deaf students in the Solomon Islands. She was born deaf, so she knows the challenges it poses to education and employment.

The school faced water shortages that often left staff and students without safe water for drinking, cooking, washing and growing vegetables.

Then Tropical Cyclone Harold damaged the school and its vegetable garden as the threat of COVID-19 loomed. With Caritas Australia's support, the school installed water tanks, provided cyclone-proof building materials, and helped to implement COVID-19 prevention measures.

Margret's school now has enough water for its students and the capacity to cater for more, and is now planning to boost food security through increased agricultural production.
