### Installation as Acolyte

This weekend marks an important step for me towards the Permanent Diaconate by being installed as an acolyte. Traditionally there have been four minor orders within the Church that worked with the major orders. These were lector, exorcist, acolyte and porter. These minor orders were directed towards the liturgy and developed during the first few centuries in the life of the Church. Pope St. Paul VI reformed the clerical orders in 1972. The minor orders of exorcist and porter were suppressed, while the orders of acolyte and lector were reformed into two special offices that are now open to the laity. Although the institution of lectors and acolytes has retained its connection with preparation for the priesthood and diaconate, the duties are often fulfilled by lay men and women.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal describes the ministry of the acolyte as, "to serve at the altar and to assist the priest and deacon. In particular, it is his responsibility to prepare the altar and the sacred vessels and, if necessary, as an extraordinary minister, to distribute the Eucharist to the faithful" (GIRM #98).

The ministries of a deacon are those of Word, Altar and Charity. By accepting the office of acolyte, I will be uniting myself more closely with the ministry of the altar, however the role of acolyte differs from that of the deacon. For me personally, receiving this office remains an important preparation for diaconal service. It is part of an ongoing process of discernment; listening to the call to service, and continuing to give my personal response to God. This discernment will necessarily intensify over the coming months.

We often talk of journeying along the path of life. The Church teaches us that we do not journey alone, but as the people of God, or to state this more intimately, the family of God. My journey towards the diaconate has been no different. I have travelled with the Church family, of friends, brothers and sisters in Christ. My journey has been importantly accompanied by my wife and children, who have generously supported me in my aspiration to serve. Please continue to support both my family and me with your prayers as we continue this journey with you.

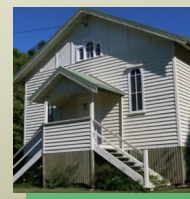

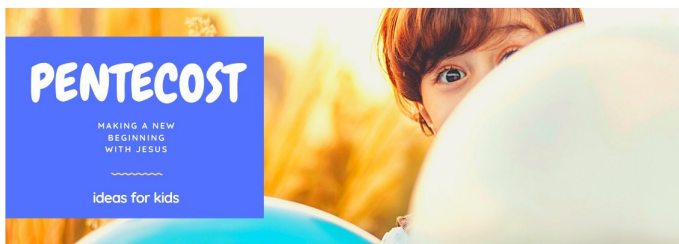

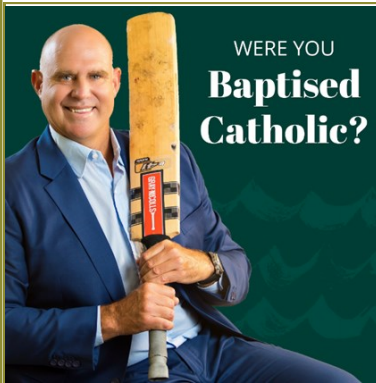

**Archbishop Mark has a message for you**

This is a time of year when we think of volunteers whom we usually take for granted. Of course the labourer deserves his or her hire; but it's volunteers who make the world go round. Many labourers work not just for the money but also for their service to the community and the satisfaction that brings. Human beings were created to work, and they share in God's creative work. But human beings were also created to volunteer - by the God who is the original volunteer. God doesn't work for pay. God works for love; and so too do volunteers. Their work, like God's, is often unseen, but that doesn't make it any less important. So we give thanks for all the volunteers - in the Church and in the wider community; and we ask ourselves, How might I volunteer my services for the sake of the community? However you do, you'll be rewarded in surprising ways.
