“Anyone who gave one of his disciples even a cup of cold water would be rewarded...” Mk. 9:45

A church was decorated for months with artificial flowers. Even though the flowers looked pretty, they lacked one vital thing – they emitted no scent. Then one day someone brought in a small bunch of fresh bluebells and placed them on the altar. As soon as people walked into the church they noticed a difference. The fragrance given off by the little bluebells filled the entire church. This is one little act of kindness that make a huge difference.

The cup of cold water that Jesus talked about in the gospel is a symbol of small kind deed. Deeds don’t have to be big in order to be of help and comfort to the person for who they are done. Small deeds are very important. They may not look much, but they create a friendly atmosphere. Even the dew lessens the heat. It doesn’t have to be big.

In the desert, a cup of water is much more important than gold neckless. It is not how much we do that matters, but how much love we put into what we do. The spirit in which a deed is done, the person to whom it is done, and the circumstances in which it is done, can magnify the effect of a small deed.

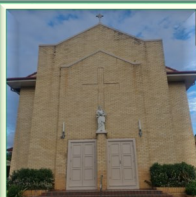
A small deed can bring comfort to the person provided it has a certain quality. Few of us are given the chance to perform great deeds. But the chance to give ‘a cup of water’ can come our way several times in the course of a day. A small act of kindness can turn winter into summer at least briefly for another person. It becomes a small but significant stepping-stone for that person.

Small gestures can tell us more about a person’s character than big gestures. Big gestures show a person’s power. Small gestures show a person’s humanity. Giving is at the heart of the Gospel. It is of the very essence of Christianity. It is through giving that the heart remains open and one becomes a loving person.

PARISH COVID-19 UPDATE & EVENTBRITE BOOKING SYSTEM

The following restrictions are in place here at St. Joseph's Parish during this time:

A. Government Regulation:

All parishioners must sign in through the QLD Check-in App

B. Archdiocesan policy—Ticketed seating - all parishioners must receive a seat number from the marshals. 100% capacity for ticketed when allocating seating when permitted. Ticketed seating means a person is given a ticket with their seat number on it and will remain (as much as possible) in their allocated seat while at the place of worship. This also means we need your name and contact details for Parish records, to record the number of your seat —

C. PLEASE continue to use the Eventbrite Mass booking system:

D. Masks must be worn in indoor or outdoor spaces if you are closer than 1 person per 2 square metres.

E. Clergy and readers who are socially distanced from others may remove their mask while speaking and then put the mask back on.

G. The choir and cantors are required to wear a mask at all times.
