Luke 9:11 - 17:

Through the Sacrament of Baptism we enter into the Body of Christ, His Church. It is the beginning of our journey into full communion with the Church. In the rite of Baptism, we die a Sacramental death with Christ so that we can rise with Him on the last day; we are clothed with Christ. We are anointed priests, prophets and kings. The white garment we receive in Baptism reflects the purity and dignity we have received.

In Confirmation, the Holy Spirit strengthens us to bear witness to Christ in both word and deed. The Holy Spirit strengthens us to live lives according to God’s call. Confirmation sets us aside, anointing us to make our lives a “living sacrifice” to God.

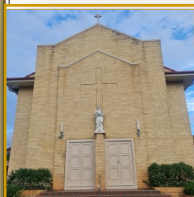
The Sacrament of the Eucharist completes our Christian Initiation. It is both spiritual food for our journey through life and the promise of Christ’s abiding presence with His people.

The Gospel story of the feeding of the five thousand recounts that the bread Jesus gives the people is not exhausted. Similarly the bread of the Eucharist that Jesus gives is never exhausted. Christ has fed His disciples with His own Body and Blood since the Last Supper and will continue to do so until the end of the world.

As we approach the Altar, the minister, holding up the sacred host proclaims, “The Body of Christ.” The Eucharist is the real presence of Christ on earth; body, blood, soul and divinity. The Church is also the Body of Christ; Christ abides in His Church through the Holy Spirit. Christ is the head, and we are His body. As we receive the real presence of Christ, we are to allow Christ to transform us into another Christ. At completion of Mass, we are sent out on the mission to bring Christ to others, to help others believe in Christ.

The children of our parish have been preparing to make their First Holy Communion this Sunday, the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. They will complete their initiation as full members of the body of Christ. As we welcome the children to the Altar for the first time, let us all encourage them to continue in the life of the parish and the Church. May the abiding presence of Christ in the Eucharist be their, and our joy and comfort.

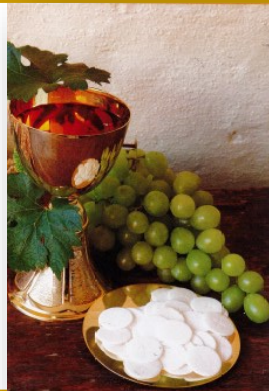

**Inner Peace in Divine Love, Nambour QLD - Jesuit
and Ignatian Spirituality Australia
A Four Week Retreat in Daily Life**

This First Spiritual Exercises retreat runs over four weeks in daily life. It guides you in prayer and reflection for 30mins each day. The retreat is for anyone who desires to grow in their relationship with God.

The retreat was composed by Michael Hansen SJ and is based on the Spiritual Exercises by St Ignatius of Loyola. This retreat is a way of encountering the Creator as Love in your everyday life through a program of personal prayer and attending a weekly gathering of guided spiritual conversation – online or in person.

What's involved

- ◆ Participants pray at home for 30mins each day, and meet together with retreat guides within a group once a week for 90mins, for listening, prayer and spiritual conversation.
- ◆ There are five 90min group meetings.
- ◆ These sessions guided by trained givers of the First Spiritual Exercises.
- ◆ It is suggested that you purchase “The First Spiritual Exercises: Four Guided Retreats” book by Michael Hansen SJ ahead of the retreat.
