Luke 12:32 - 48: See that you are dressed for action

Jesus often draws from the history of Israel when He is teaching His disciples. He uses phrases that would have been familiar to his audience, triggering in them memories of significant events recorded in Scripture.

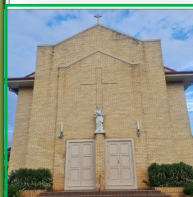
“See that you are dressed for action” (RSV Lk 12:35) would have reminded His disciples of the night of the original Passover. The manner in which the People of Israel were to eat the Passover Lamb was to be “dressed for action.” A better translation would be “Gird your loins” (NAB Lk 12:35). The bottom hem of the robes of men were tucked into their belts to allow them to walk freely. God had instructed the People of Israel to have this attitude of readiness for action on Passover night, as they would be fleeing Egypt in a hurry.

“..... have your lamps lit” (Lk 12:35) suggests being ready, even in the event of a nocturnal return of the master. “..... in the second watch he comes, or in the third” indicates the master’s return could be very late in the night. The People of Israel had to leave Egypt in the middle of the night. They had been warned beforehand to be prepared.

We do not know the hour of Christ’s return at the end of time. We do know that he will return, and that we need to be ready “for action.” We have a choice between two ways of living in preparation for Jesus’ return. We can sell what is superfluous in our lives and give money as alms for the poor. We can share our time and resources with others, serving them according to our abilities. We can live in a way that reflects our belief; that all are made in the “image and likeness” of God (Gen 1:26). This is how the early Christians lived. (Acts 2:44, 4:32). This is how we “Get [ourselves] purses that do not wear out” (Lk 12:33). The alternative is to be selfish, to hoard things for ourselves, refusing to give to others, enjoying the things of the world just for ourselves. This way of living closes us off from other people and ultimately from God.

Jesus gives us the example of service, that the master, “..... will put on an apron, sit them down at table and wait on them” (Lk 12:37). This phrase links this passage to the Last Supper, when Jesus put on an apron to “wait” upon the twelve Apostles. Jesus serves us today in the person of the Priest, at the altar at Mass, so that we can respond in love by serving our brothers and sisters. How ready are we for action?

2022 SAFEGUARDING TRAINING LEVEL 1 & LEVEL 2



Dear Parish Volunteer

Thank you for your ongoing commitment to supporting our Parish community in the various ministries.

It has been 3 years since we have undertaken the **Level 1 safeguarding** training required of **all volunteers** with parishes in the Brisbane Archdiocese. This training is now due for renewal by **all volunteers prior to 1st September 2022.**

There are two options to renew this training. Online using a computer OR by joining in a 1 hour volunteer training session in the Parish Ryan Room on **Monday 22nd August at 11:00am.** Please email or phone the Parish office to register your preferred option for the training session.

Certain volunteers need also to complete the higher level of safeguarding training, Level 2, (e.g. roles which involve access to church keys/codes and/or roles involved with children or aged care visitation etc). Please refer to the volunteer, matrix which is available in the office, to check your ministry requirements.

It is most important that you **confirm completion** of this training as Safeguarding training that is not properly registered with the People & Culture (HR) Office in Brisbane will not be recognised for compliance.

You can utilize the online confirmation link for both levels 1 & 2, **please notify the parish office if you choose this option** OR download a hardcopy and send the completed forms into the office to be verified and forwarded to the Archdiocesan office.

Archbishop Mark has a message for you

This week we had the latest in the Laurel Blow Speaker Series which is part of our [Archdiocesan Reconciliation Plan](#). Laurel Blow was a Butchulla woman from Fraser Island originally, and she was the first Indigenous woman to be appointed to a position in the Archdiocese where she made a unique contribution in the area of Indigenous education. Each year we invite a speaker to reflect upon a theme concerning Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples; and this year [our speaker was Dr Jackie Huggins](#), well known as an Indigenous writer, historian and social activist. Jackie's theme was "Truth-telling: My Family Story", picking up one of the three themes of the Uluru Statement from the Heart (truth-telling, treaty and voice). The story she told was intensely personal, and yet it had a much wider resonance. It was the story of all Indigenous Australians and, in the end, the story of all Australians. The event was held at the ACU Banyo campus, with Evangelisation Brisbane working closely with ACU to organise the gathering. That's a good partnership helping to build a good partnership between Indigenous and non-Indigenous Australia.
